A Message from the Mayor

We are trying to undertake a range of projects and services for our residents throughout all of the towns in our Council area. Last year we had almost \$18 million in development compared to \$15 million the previous year and this included over \$11 million for dwellings. This augers well for the building industry and our communities. The Mannum Waters Marina continues to progress with housing developments and houseboat moorings sales/interest. We approved community grants to 11 community organisations, have agreed to a trial to extend the Morgan Library opening hours from 8 am - 11 am on Saturday mornings, have approved the purchase of playground equipment and shelter for the Nildottie JKG Memorial Playground with the Progress Association and Lions contributing a majority of costs for the project and we are working with the Murraylands and Riverland Regional Development Australia to produce new Invest Murraylands marketing material "Ready for Business and Place to Live".

Council has appointed a new Arts and Cultural Development Officer, Ms Tis Milner-Nichols, and we welcome Tis on board to the Council team and look forward to this partnership with Country Arts SA increasing interest and participation in arts and cultural development throughout our Council area. We continue to work with the Mid Murray Support Services to upgrade the old Mannum Primary School and have issued a lease for the building as a Community Centre. Council has adopted a Tourism Policy and Tourism Action Plan 2012 – 2014 to continue to progress tourism initiatives and projects and received \$100,000 in seed funding to undertake the investigation and design of the Truro Community Wastewater Management Scheme. We are also undertaking the resealing of 12 kms of bitumen road and the resheeting of 30 kms of unsealed roads during this financial year. Council has also assisted in the production of the cycle trek between Mannum and Sedan and have amended the Morgan Community Bus Policy so that children from Morgan and Cadell can participate in football, netball and basketball in Waikerie using this bus.

Council's congratulations go to Brett Stapleton who was named as the Australian Animal Management Officer of the Year, in recognition of excellence and professionalism within local government animal management. I would also like to congratulate Council's Community Development Manager Shane Thompson, Amy Loechel, Community Development Officer (Youth, Sport & Recreation) and Team for winning the State Local Government Risk Management Award for the Fun 4 YOUth Project. Council received \$20,000 as the State winner for this

FIRE DANGER SEASON

The Fire Danger Season for those properties in the Murraylands and Riverland Fire Ban Districts extends from 15 November 2012 to 15 April 2013.

It has reached that time of the year where residents and visitors in the Mid Murray Council area must consider the requirements of the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 when lighting fires.

It will be necessary to obtain a permit for any fires in the open during the Fire Danger Season. Permits will not be issued for burning off before 1 February 2013.

Residents and visitors are reminded that Police Officers and Council Fire Prevention Officers are empowered to issue 'on the spot' fines for certain breaches of the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005.

CHRISTMAS PAGEANTS

This December the Mid Murray OPAL and Fun 4 YOUth teams will bring some extra fun and excitement to the Morgan (8th) and Mannum (1st) Christmas Pageants with Cobba the Corn tagging along for both events.

Cobba the Corn is a lively and friendly giant character from the Crunch Bunch who will help the OPAL team promote healthy ideas for barbecues, including getting more vegetables on the grill this summer.

Cobba the Corn made plenty of young friends at the Mannum Teddy Bears' Picnic and is looking forward to meeting more local families at the pageants.

ELECTRONIC WASTE (E-WASTE)

Due to environmental and legislative requirements along with the recent conversion of analogue television to digital service, Mid Murray Council is undertaking a proactive approach in relation to dealing with electronic waste (e-waste). As of September 2013, E-waste will be banned from all South Australian landfill sites.

As part of Council's commitment to providing a service to residents and ratepayers, E-waste will be received free of charge at all waste transfer stations and resource recovery sites. Proof of residence may be required at the collection point.

E-waste consisting of household appliances including fridges, freezers, stoves, microwaves (whitegoods etc) will continue to be received as metal/steel waste products and disposed of accordingly as scrap steel/metal.

E-waste comprising televisions, computer components, printers, scanners and stereo/radio equipment, toasters etc will be received at the Council collection points free of charge and will be stored at the Mannum Resource Recovery Centre and Cambrai Landfill Site. To qualify as a recyclable product, televisions and computer monitors must **not** be broken when deposited at the collection point. When a sufficient quantity of E-waste has accumulated at these sites, it will be transported to other approved facilities where it will be further processed and recycled.

The public will be encouraged to dispose of fluorescent tubes and globes at any of the participating approved disposal facilities available. Please refer to Zero Waste SA website for further details. www.zerowaste.sa.gov.au

CAMPING PERMIT SYSTEM

HAYTHORPE RESERVE & TENBURY HUNTER RESERVE

Council is introducing an overnight camping permit system for Haythorpe Reserve, Mannum and Tenbury Hunter Reserve, Swan Reach. The permit system will commence on 1 December 2012.

The system comprises:-

- a permit fee of \$10.00 per vehicle per night
- a maximum camping period of five consecutive days
- a minimum four week break in camping period.

The aim of the permit system is to ensure that there is a small fee which will contribute to ongoing maintenance and upgrading of the reserves for the benefit of users.

DISABLED ACCESS INCENTIVE SCHEME

Council has again endorsed a scheme that provides grants of up to \$500 to assist the private sector and community bodies in improving access for people with disabilities.

The scheme is an example of Council's commitment to its Disability Access Action Plan which endorses the principle of equal access.

The offices of Council will close at 12 noon on Monday 24 December 2012 and re-open at 9 am on Wednesday 2 January 2013.


All waste disposal sites will be closed on Christmas Day, New Years Day and on Fire Ban Days.

BUDGET INCOME 2012/2013




Total Budget Income includes loans received and reserves funds transfers is \$21,426,697

MOSQUITOES

Try to avoid going outside during dusk and dawn as this is when the mosquitoes are most active. If you are having a BBQ for tea burn some citronella candles upwind.

Check around your home to ensure there are no pools of stagnant water in places such as pot plant saucers, gutters, septic tanks, rainwater tanks (paraffin oil can be put into the tanks), old tyres, ponds and dams. Check fly wires on your doors and windows – they don't need a big hole to get in.

Council is continually monitoring mosquito numbers and treating mosquito breeding sites but mosquito numbers

can only be controlled to a certain degree so it's most important to cover up when going outside. Nobody deserves a mosquito bite!

Earlier this year the opportunity came about for Council to relocate gym equipment from the Mannum Leisure Centre, to Cambrai and Morgan communities to support and help to establish two local community gyms. Pam Cutjar, Mannum Leisure Centre Manager and Healthy Murraylands have helped with the equipment transfer and development of gym protocols to encourage new members and participants to join the gym.

The Sedan Cambrai Football Netball Club had earlier set up a basic gym with a range of second hand equipment, mostly used by local sport teams. The committee welcomed the arrival of six additional pieces of equipment and with a building touch up including new paint, the gym was relaunched in March as the Cambrai Community Gym.
