Farm Fire Units

Farm Fire Units (FFU) play a vital part in assisting the South Australian Country Fire Service (CFS) respond to bushfires. FFUs can often be the first vehicles on a fire ground, particularly in remote areas, and are likely to know the local landscape which is of great assistance to our firefighters.

The CFS encourages people with a FFU fitted to a registered vehicle or trailer to register as a FFU with the CFS. Charge your cars in Morgan and Truro



Mid Murray Council, working in partnership with the South Australian Government and the Royal Automobile Association of South Australia is proud to host Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations in both Morgan and Truro.

The RAA and SA Government are building South Australia's first border-to-border network of EV charging stations - RAA Charge. Construction has already started, with the 140-site network to be completed in 2024.

As the world embraces EV's the need for more options to charge them across the state is evident. RAA Charge, places charging stations in key identified locations to benefit tourism, EV owners, and locals alike.

"The Morgan charging facility is already operational at 17 Railway Terrace, Morgan (adjacent the riverbank precinct)" said Mayor Simone Bailey, "whilst we anticipate the Truro facility at James Street West to come on line shortly."

Planning Institute of Australia Awards for Planning Excellence

Congratulations to Council's Planning Department, which, in collaboration with Planning and Land Use Services (PLUS), Department for Trade and Investment, and the River Murray Flood Planning and Building Working Group (consisting of Mid Murray Council (MMC), Rural City of Murray Bridge (RCMB), Berri Barmera Council, District Council of Loxton Waikerie (DCLW) and Renmark Paringa Council) took out both the Climate Change and Resilience Award, and the President's Award at the Planning Institute of Australia's Awards for Planning Excellence for the River Murray Flood Resilience Code Amendment project.

This was an exceptional result for such a significant and purposeful project for our region.
